De-streamed courses make up the main pathway for the majority of Grade 9 students. By working collaboratively in an inclusive and engaging learning environment, students develop critical skills such as problem solving, communication, inquiry and technology skills. Students with a variety of abilities and interests can achieve success by working through a wide range of learning opportunities.

Locally Developed courses emphasize skill acquisition required for success in Grade 11 and 12 Workplace and Open courses and experiential learning.

Students must earn the following compulsory credits to obtain the **Ontario Secondary School Diploma** 18 Compulsory Credits: 4 credits in English (1 credit per grade) 3 credits in Math (at least 1 credit in Gr. 11 or 12) credit in Health & Physical Education 2 credits in Science credit in French as a Second Language 1 credits in Canadian History 0.5 credit in Career Studies 0.5 credit in Civics 1 credits in Canadian Geography Plus one credit from each of the following groups: additional credit in English, or French as a Second Language, or a Native language, or a Classical or international language, or social sciences and the humanities, or Canadian and world studies, or guidance and career education, or cooperative education. 1 Group 2: additional credit in health and physical education, or the arts, or business studies, or French as a Second Language, or cooperative education. 1 Group 3: additional credit in science (grade 11 or 12), or technological education, or French as a second language. 12 optional credits In addition to the compulsory credits, at least 2 online learning credits students must complete: the Provincial Literacy Requirement

The Ontario Secondary School Certificate (OSSC)

will be granted upon request to students who leave school before earning the Ontario Secondary Diploma, provided that they have earned a minimum of 14 credits.

The Certificate of Accomplishment

Students who are leaving secondary school upon reaching the age of 18 without having met the requirements for the Ontario Secondary School Diploma or the Ontario Secondary School Certificate may be granted a Certificate of Accomplishment.

The Certificate of Accomplishment may be a useful means of recognizing achievement for students who plan to take certain kinds of further training, or who plan to find employment directly after leaving school.

The Certificate of Accomplishment is to be accompanied by the student's Ontario Student Transcript.

Special Education

The Special Education Philosophy of the Windsor-Essex Catholic District School Board will be to provide meaningful, student-focused educational opportunities for all students. 
